***Quicktime is recommended for PowerPoint presentation narrations that feature annotations or digital laser pointers.**


Office 365 - PowerPoint for Mac - creating a screen recording with audio

Since recording audio over slides in PowerPoint for Mac is not supported, this article details how to use QuickTime to do a screen recording of a PowerPoint presentation with audio recorded from the internal microphone.

• Open QuickTime:




 $\bullet\,$ Go to the file menu and select "New Screen Recording":



• The Screen Recording window will open:



• Click the down arrow next to the record button and select the Microphone as the Internal Microphone:






• Click the record button:

Click to record the full screen. Drag to record part of the screen. End recording by clicking the stop button in the menu bar.

- Once the recording starts, start the PowerPoint presentation and speak as needed during the recording.
- Once the recording is completed, click the stop button on the menu bar. A window with the recording will come up. Go to File and click Save and save the file to your Desktop.
